## Colorado Registered Voters Survey Topline Results

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Magellan Strategies are pleased to present the topline results for a 500n live survey of registered voters in the state of Colorado. The interviews were conducted April 26<sup>th</sup> – 27<sup>th</sup>, 2017. This survey has a margin of error of +/- 4.38% at the 95 percent confidence interval. The survey is weighted on past off-year general election demographics.

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*T1. Are you registered to vote in Colorado as a Republican, a Democrat, an unaffiliated voter, or are you not registered to vote?*

Republican.....	39%
Democrat.....	33%
Unaffiliated.....	28%

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*T2. Although it is a long way off, how likely are you to vote in the 2018 November elections for Congress, Governor and the state legislature? Would you say you are extremely likely, very likely, somewhat likely or are you unlikely to vote?*

Extremely Likely.....	71%
Very Likely.....	20%
Somewhat Likely.....	6%
Unlikely.....	3%
Refused.....	0%

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T3. I am now going to read to you a question that may be on the ballot this November regarding transportation funding. After hearing the ballot language, please tell me if you would vote YES and approve the ballot question or if you would vote NO and reject the ballot question. Please listen carefully. The ballot question reads as...

*“Shall state debt be increased by three point five billion dollars (\$3.5 billion) with a maximum repayment cost of five point two billion dollars (\$5.2 billion) without raising taxes,*

*by a change to the Colorado Revised Statutes requiring the issuance of transportation bonds, and, in connection therewith, shall bond proceeds be retained as a voter approved revenue change,*

*and used exclusively to fund specified road and bridge expansion, construction, maintenance, and repair projects throughout the state?”*

*If the election were being held today, would you vote YES and approve the ballot question or would you vote NO and reject the ballot question?*

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**Survey Methodology**

This survey was conducted by live dialing both landline and cell phone sample. The sample used for this survey was randomly drawn from a state of Colorado voter file. The interviews were conducted April 26<sup>th</sup> – 27<sup>th</sup>, 2017. This survey was weighted based on past off-year general election voting demographics. Three attempts were made to interview each household in the sample. This survey has a margin of error of +/- 4.38% at the 95 percent confidence interval.

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
