
MR. MOODY in a recent sermon is reported to have said: "A thousand Jews met not long ago in Paris, when one of the orators said, 'We have the honor of killing the Christians' God,' and this was greatly applauded." Whereat the editor of the *Jewish Messenger* says: "What Mr. Moody's object may have been in thus giving currency to so absurd a fabrication I do not know. But I do assert that no such meeting was held at Paris, that such a meeting of 1,000 Jews has not taken place anywhere for years, and when Jews do meet together they are not likely to applaud the sentiment quoted." Moody's mistake, however, was after all not so much in making the misstatement as in pursuing the vein of thought that led him to hazard such a doubtful assertion. Even if it had been true that the Jews of Paris congratulated themselves on Calvary, he had no right to excite the **bad passions** of his audience by appealing to **sectarian hatred** by the recital of the fact.
